A meeting of the Government Relations Committee was planned with Dorothy Shephard, Minister for Social Development for Thursday July 27th, but now that she has stepped down as Minister, we don't know if her replacement will honour the appointment. We are keeping our fingers crossed!

The Programs and Services Committee met on June 15th to discuss how to proceed with our grant from the New Horizons for seniors Program. Our project is called Gatherings to learn and socialize and educational sessions will be offered throughout the province.
